Meetings are either held at Dartford or Sevenoaks or on Zoom. They are open to all, but a donation towards the cost of the speaker is welcome from non-members.


WORKSHOPS & GROUPS

DOES ANYONE KNOW CAN ANYONE HELP.....

The Society Library has received a request from a member & former Society Officer. I have edited it slightly.

In the process of decluttering I have found a large envelope which I must have acquired years ago when I was NWKFHS secretary, probably when a member died. (I vaguely remember giving a pile of BRYAN information from a deceased member to the Society ages ago.) Ił (the current envelope) contains correspondence, research results & photocopies of documents (wills, birth briefs, service records) relating to members of the BRYAN & DREWELL families in different parts of London including NWK. There is also a hand-written, lengthy account, in rhyme of the Calerock Lighthouse Disaster 1.12.1881 "BY ONE THAT WAS THERE"! (written by Frederick James Drewell).
