EXCHANGE JOURNALS

At last week's meeting of the Society Trustees it was decided to stop participating in the Exchange Journal system, the main reasons are twofold:

- 1. Oher societies are gradually abandoning paper Exchange Journals going over to online only so the number we receive is gradually diminishing.
- Every month at the Dartford meeting the journals, in 6 heavy boxes, are taken out of storage & displayed for the attendees to peruse &/or borrow. This year especially almost nobody comes to look. After which at the end of the meeting they have to be put back in storage.

Also with lack of volunteers to help there is no back-up to run the stall at times of holidays or sickness.

The Trustees are trying to simplify the Society & this is one thing that can help. The current journals held will be passed to Louise on the Ephemera stall where they can be bough for a small donation.

LONDON METROPOLITAN ARCHIVE'S CHANGES

With effect from the 5th August 2024 The London Metropolitan Archives (LMA) is changing it's name to The London Archives. It's owners, the City of London Corporation, have received feedback from workshops & surveys where there appears to be a lot of confusion around the word Metropolitan. Were they the archives for the Metropolitan Police? the Metropolitan tube line? or London Metropolitan University? It is hoped that this change & rebranding is hoped to make it clearer to all what services they can help the public with. As well as the name change a new website is under development.

At the same time as the change of name a free display, 'Magna Carta & King John ' is opening. It features 2 of the most iconic documents in the archives' collections, London's Magna Carta (1297), the 1st time it will have been on public display at the LMA, & the Mayoralty charter of King John (1215).

With over 100km of books, maps, photographs, films & documents dating back to 1067 held in its strong rooms, London Metropolitan Archives (LMA) records the history of the capital, preserving & sharing the stories of Londoners, businesses, charities, hospitals, schools, community groups, & many others.

The City of London Corporation is one of the largest funders of heritage & cultural activities in the UK, investing over £130m every year. The organisation manages a range of world-class cultural & heritage institutions, including the Barbican Centre, Tower Bridge, Guildhall School of Music & Drama, Guildhall Art Gallery, London Metropolitan Archives, & Keats House. It also supports the London Symphony Orchestra & the Museum of London.
